Hearing Happening Hoping Journey with God's Word this Lent Week 6: Mark 11:1-10 The Word Draws Near



Before we read, we pray together:

Mark 11:1-10

And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus, and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out.

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!"
