Sunday Word of God - January 23rd 2022 - What is the Word of God?

We often identify the Bible as the Word of God. This is not wrong, but God speaks to our hearts in many different ways. For instance, he speaks to us in prayer and through our conscience, and often through other people.

Hence, the Word of God covers much more than a printed book. Nevertheless, the Bible is the privileged collection of communications between God and his people. These stories and poems have nourished the lives of the people of Israel and the Christian Church right through the centuries, and they continue to nourish us today. They tell the story of God's love and our salvation from ancient times onwards. The scriptural texts offer us both challenge and encouragement for our lives, and are especially valuable to us through the hope they offer us at dark moments.

Christian Unity Week continues... 18th-25th January 2022 'We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship him' (Mt2:2)

This is a call for churches to work together so that we can all build a good future according to God's heart, a future in which all human beings can experience life, peace, justice, and love.

To unite with one another, we must love one another, to love one another, we must know one another; to know one another, we must go and meet one another.



Daily questions to reflect on:

Day 1: Where have you sought 'the light' in the midst of darkness? Day 2: What Christian leader (either local or national) do you admire for the ability to inspire unity and a concern for justice? What qualities enable that person to lead effectively?

Day 3: When have you been disturbed into doing what was right? Day 4: How might our local churches become "Bethlehems" – places where Christ can be born, welcomed and honoured?

Day 5: How is God guiding your Christian community at this time? Where are you being called to act?

Day 6: Within your worship as a local Christian community what are the barriers you face to greater unity and how might they be overcome? Day 7: How do you consider the importance of church as a place for offering worship and as a place from which to call for social justice? Day 8: How does it feel when your familiar ways or traditions are challenged?



"Where to from here?" This question another way of putting the purpose of our Synodal Pathways: what does God want of his church? How can we be as a community of faith so as to serve the Good News and offer to all the word of life? As we imagine our future together, we stand in need of fresh inspiration and new energy. The regeneration of faith can have no other genesis than God's living word.

On the Sunday of the Word of God, we celebrate the gift of the Scriptures, a gift which goes on giving and can energise us with a new vision. May the words of Jesus be our experience too:: This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' May the Spirit guide our reading and our listening, our living and our proclamation of the Good News.
