Archbishop Farrell on the Death of Pope Francis

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Timothy 4:7) Right to the very end! With everything he had! Last Thursday—Holy Thursday—Pope Francis visited Rome's Regina Coeli prison. He was too weak to wash the prisoners' feet, but even in his weakness, he found the strength to be with those who are of little value in the eyes of the world. On Sunday—Easter Sunday—he would summon the strength to greet the faithful from the Balcony of St Peter's Basilica, and afterwards find the generosity of spirit to greet the crowd in St Peter's Square itself. From his first appearance on the balcony of St Peter's the night of his election, to his last, hours before his death, his was a papacy of radical presence to all God's people.
